## Navy Base Terminal - Veterans Terminal Charleston, SC

### Specifications and Services

The Port of Charleston has numerous terminals that steamship lines may call. Transit times from the sea buoy to these terminals range from one hour to 2.5 hours. The channel depth at mean low water is 45'.

SSA Cooper is a full service stevedore handling containers, break bulk - paper products, lumber, steel, reefer cargo, heavy lifts, RoRo, bulk commodities, and passenger vessels. We also work lash mother vessels at the dock, which provides barge work for the company and are active in the stuffing and stripping of containers as the sole stevedore with the Container Freight Station subsidy.

**Location:** 2.0 hours transit to Sea Buoy

**Size:** 110 acres

**Water Depth:** 35 feet low water

**Berths:** 4 (Finger piers)

- Pier Lima - 977' length - 70' wide (under lease to McAllister Tug Company)
